My homiletics instructors at the seminary taught that there are two ways to handle writer's block; but before they then began their lesson, they thought it best to give the proper motivation by, saying; "Ready or not, *Sunday's coming.*" They would then add; "You can either get up in that pulpit because you have to say something, or you can get up into that pulpit because you have something to say. "The implication was that one must put proper effort into his studies, only then will the Holy Spirit give him something to say. But either way, Sunday is coming!

So, as I pondered their wisdom, I wondered if their way of thinking also applied to writing this letter to you. As I paused, and wondered what to write, I was blessed by the unusual quiet of the St Peter has written; "As each of you morning—the trees are still this morning and the air is calm and damp. Except for the occasional car or pickup passing by, the only sound I hear is the persistent squawk of a Bluejay. And then it occurred to me how nice it is to pause and enjoy the quiet.

Now, by this time in this letter, you might be thinking to yourself; "he's writing about these things because he has to say something." And you'd be partially correct, but I've found that many writings begin that way, but they don't end that way; the "having to say something," often evolves into "having something to say." And I have something to say to you; because as I

paused and pondered—as I listened to that Bluejay interrupting the quiet of the morning, I had the privilege of witnessing something beautiful; something bigger than myself. In the few short moments of pondering, I witnessed one of our members faithfully doing battle with an oak tree; morning and evening this battle rages on so that other members might be spared the danger of falling because of acorns on the walkway and parking spaces. And though that was enough to make me smile, I was also privileged to witness mother and son take time out of their busy morning to prepare a Sunday School classroom and lesson mother teaching her son, by example, the importance of learning God's holy word. Though these things were but moments in a day, they remind me of the beauty of God's family, and I am humbled by the many faithful people who make Peace Lutheran Church the God pleasing ministry that it is.

"We Are All Beggars"

In the early morning hours of Feb. 18, 1546, Martin Luther closed his eyes forever. Before that happened, the hand that hammered the 95 Theses into the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg on Oct. 31, 1517, penned its final words: "We are all beggars. This is true." And this is the truth that our Lord says makes you free.

Ironic, isn't it? In order to be free, you must be a beggar. You must be utterly dependent and reliant upon God. This makes us uncomfortable – the way we're uncomfortable when someone gets us a Christmas present when we haven't gotten them one. We feel we owe them. And we don't like being in someone's debt like that.

But what Luther would remind us is that we are all indeed beggars. And we're not just anyone's beggars. We're God's beggars. Christ came for sinners. He came to seek and save the lost. He came to heal the sick and raise the dead. He came for sinners, and He dwells only with sinners.

If we are to be where He is, we must be willing to be counted among the lost, the sick, and the dead. We must be willing to be beggars. We must cry out for mercy, for grace, and for his undeserved love and kindness. We must be dependent solely on Him and what He gives.

And here's the beauty: He gives us everything. Everything. Forgiveness of sins, salvation from death and the devil, and eternal life. This isn't because of any worthiness or merit in us. It is because of His divine goodness, mercy, and grace. On account of Christ's death and resurrection, the Father forgives you, saves you, and is pleased with you. You receive His love, His righteousness, His holiness, His acceptance, and His inheritance. We are all beggars. This is true.

This is the heart and soul of Christianity and the lifeblood of the Christian Church. God justifies us and declares us innocent and righteous by His grace received through faith for the sake of Christ. This isn't because of our works but because of His work on the cross. We, who once were enemies of God, are reconciled to Him and made to be His children.

This is what Luther pointed us to when He took up his pen for the last time and scribbled "We are all beggars. This is true." We are beggars, but we are beggars of the God who does not ignore us and who doesn't pass by us on the other side. We are beggars of the One who descended from heaven to make His dwelling with sinners.

We are beggars of Him who deigns to dwell with us, among us, and – yes – still in us by grace for Christ's sake. For in the bread and cup that we bless we share together with Christ and each other the riches of God's grace. The riches of this grace – the Gospel in sermon and absolution, in Baptism, and in Holy Communion – are so inexhaustible that our cups overflow. We, who are God's beggars, are inexhaustibly satisfied, and we have something to give back in thanksgiving and praise.

PEACE TALK

Once upon a time.... What do you think of when you hear this phrase? Are you drawn into adventure land ready to experience unexplained wonders? Children's books often start with this expression because it makes you excited or intrigued to hear more. It is like an invitation to open your mind and let the imagination drift into paradise. Or maybe it's a reflection of a life experience. Once upon a time I was fast, strong, or successful. Or possibly a lament. Once upon a time I had money, a happy family, or a successful sports team. In either case, we are looking back and reflecting on what is long past. Sooner or later, God just might use this reflection to help you move forward. I know He did in my life. "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. *Live as children of light"* (Ephesians 5:8) I would venture to say many of us have experienced darkness in our faith "once upon a time" before God called us back with his grace. In this verse Paul tells the Ephesians; Once you were really dead; but now you are really alive in Christ. Once you were really separated from God, but now you have been brought near through Christ. Once you were darkness, but now you are "light in the Lord." Does this ring a bell "once upon a time" in your life? If so, you can relate how the Holy Spirit has worked in your heart. Indeed, a wonderful feeling. What you will experience is a fundamental reality change, a genuine transformation, when you receive God's grace through faith. A transition moving from past to present... "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Corinthians 5:17). The old has gone, the new is here! Therefore, through faith, we live a new life in Christ Jesus. Sin no longer rules over us because of the sacrifice Jesus made for us on the cross. We are told in Romans 6:10, "For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God." Christ gave Himself for us "once upon a time" and by His resurrection, showed the world that sin and death is defeated. Thus, a new life given to us through our faith. This new life we now can live in Christ is filled with the joy of an eternal promise. I know there will be challenges and difficulties that we will encounter but there is always a joy to be found in a life lived for God. The new life in Christ never gets old, renewed each and every day with this timeless story... Once upon a time, "God so loved the world, that He sent His one and only Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life." (John 3:16) And all God's people said, Amen.
