Repenting of "Yours" and "Mine"

Retailers have had their Christmas displays up since before Reformation Sunday. The kids have made their list and checked it twice, or three times or more. It won't be long before the tree will start shedding its needles, the stockings emptied, the gifts unwrapped, toys broken, and the too small or out of style clothes returned. Before we know it, the annual celebration of Christmas will be over.

But for the children of God, we know that the gift of Christmas doesn't ever end. Week in and week out, the Lord continues to shower His gifts on us. Every time the Lord gathers us to His house, and we are led to kneel at His table, the gift of forgiveness is repeatedly granted to us. It is nothing we deserve. It comes to us freely!

The fourth stanza of the stewardship hymn, "Forgive Us Lord for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) highlights both this gift and our response. *Teach us, O Lord, true thankfulness divine, that gives as Christ gave, never counting cost*

To learn thankfulness is necessary. The parents of young children are well-versed in the fact that they must teach their children thankfulness. It does not come naturally. The spiritual genetics inherited from our parents allow us to think that the world revolves around us. When we receive something, there is an inward desire to think that we in some way deserve it.

But there is no way that we deserve anything we get from our Lord. We need that ongoing lesson from God Himself. Thankfulness toward God is worked in us by the Holy Spirit. God's Word works this thanksgiving in us. We need this weekly reminder that Jesus didn't consider "equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself" for us, to the point of death on a cross (Phil. 2:6). He didn't bat an eye. He paid the price! Our life of stewardship is one of daily and weekly thanksgiving inspired by the Lord Himself. That knows no barrier of "yours" and "mine," assured that only what's withheld is lost.

Because Jesus gave us everything and more, there can be no ownership. The child at Christmas is quick to claim that the newly gifted toy is "mine!" But as Psalm 24:1 asserts, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof, the world and those who dwell therein." There isn't anything in creation that is ours. When we cling to and claim ownership of anything in creation, we are losing out on the continual gifts with which the Lord desires to shower upon us. Closed hands cannot receive anything new. We cling to the old and dead and miss the new thing that the Lord desires to do in and for us.

We are led to repent of the "yours" and "mine" and remove the lie that we have any ownership. In this we have the promise that God will continue to give to us. Not just at Christmas, but every Sunday at the altar in the Lord's house.

PEACE TALK

Snow day! Sweet music to the ears of a child. That translated into school being canceled and a fun packed day forthcoming. I remember those special days. What should I do first? Work on my model Camaro? Play a board game? Go outside to build a snow man? Or I might just go sled riding. The more it snowed the better. A snow day was always a highlight during those winter months. As an adult I don't see it quite like that anymore. I see snow days now only as an extra burden. Namely, because I must remove all that snow to complete the daily task I have impending. With snow shovel in hand, I ponder... wouldn't it be grand if I could still have the elation of a child on a snow day? Maybe not the urge to go sledding, but to see that falling snow as a heavenly reminder; that all I can accomplish, all that I have worked hard for, is comparatively fleeting to what the Lord can do with one stroke of His magnificent brush. With that in mind and amidst a world full of agenda's, we can all use this reminder to "be still and know that He is God" (Psalm 46:10). In fact, it is just one of the many beautiful memos God uses to show that He is in control of all the circumstances that transpire in our life, (Philippians 4:6-7). God can use a simple fresh blanket of white snow to demonstrate how easy it is for Him to cover up the darkness of the earth. Thus, a beautiful symbol of concealing all that is unclean, (Psalm 51:7). Providing a new perspective of how I should find a way to look at this snow day as just another method of God's grace instead of seeing it as adding work to my space, (Hebrews 4:16). So, what changed my perspective of a simple snow day between the time of when I was a child to now? If older means wiser, then I must admit that great merit must be given to the humility naturally possessed in the heart of a child (Matthew 18:1-5). As we grow older, the worries of the world creep into our hearts and suddenly, tangible things become important. Work seems to be a priority. Self-centered ideals become our idols. Snow days thus becomes burdensome. Not that shoveling snow will ever be joyous, but submitting to the wonderous works of our mighty God will be. Slowing down and taking a closer look at that deep white wonderland with the perspective that He is bigger than this world. A reminder that my needs, pains and desires are in the hands of my Lord who is so much greater and powerful than I, (Isaiah 55:8-9). If I can do that, then just maybe I can look at that snow day with the same elation I did in my youth. Dear Lord, help me look at the snow days in my life with gratitude and thanksgiving. For all good and perfect gifts come from You (James 1:17). Amen.
