and to be his servants,
everyone who keeps the Sabbath and does not

and make them joyful in my house of prayer;
their burnt offerings and their sacrifices
will be accepted on my altar;
for my house shall be called a house of prayer

for all peoples."

Epistle

Romans 11:1–2a, 13–15, 28–32

¹I ask, then, has God rejected his people? By no means!

For I myself am an Israelite, a descendant of Abraham, a
member of the tribe of Benjamin. ²God has not rejected his
people whom he foreknew. . . .

¹³Now I am speaking to you Gentiles. Inasmuch then as I
am an apostle to the Gentiles, I magnify my ministry ¹⁴in order
somehow to make my fellow Jews jealous, and thus save some
of them. ¹⁵For if their rejection means the reconciliation of the
world, what will their acceptance mean but life from the dead? . . .

²⁸As regards the gospel, they are enemies of God for your sake.

But as regards election, they are beloved for the sake of their
forefathers. ²⁹For the gifts and the calling of God are

irrevocable. ³⁰Just as you were at one time disobedient to God
but now have received mercy because of their disobedience, ³¹so
they too have now been disobedient in order that by the mercy
shown to you they also may now receive mercy. ³²For God has
consigned all to disobedience, that he may have mercy on all.

Matthew 15:21-28

²¹Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the
district of Tyre and Sidon. ²²And behold, a Canaanite woman
from that region came out and was crying, "Have mercy on me,
O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a
demon." ²³But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples
came and begged him, saying, "Send her away, for she is
crying out after us." ²⁴He answered, "I was sent only to the lost
sheep of the house of Israel." ²⁵But she came and knelt before
him, saying, "Lord, help me." ²⁶And he answered, "It is not right to
take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs." ²⁷She said,
"Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their
masters' table." ²⁸Then Jesus answered her, "O woman, great is
your faith! Be it done for you as you desire." And her daughter
was healed instantly.
