The time of Easter is upon us. It is during this time of Lent that we come before our God in repentance recognizing our need for a Savior, but look forward to the love of God shown to us through Christ Jesus on the cross. That love becomes very real for us as we examine the empty tomb on Easter morning and can only exclaim with Christians around the world that "He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!"

Having had a little windshield time here over the course of the past month, I have made trips east and west. It got me thinking about a story I had heard of a little boy asking his father how big God's love is. All the boy knew what what was around him and where he had been in his lifetime.

Peace Lutheran Church's FIRE Youth Ministry exists to extend Jesus' love to all senior high school students, to help them grow in their relationship with the Lord, to praise and honor God in Christian service, and to care for one another.

The above statement is the reason for our youth ministry's existence. This statement is built around the five purposes found in the Great Commandment of loving God and our neighbor (Matt. 22:37-40); and in the Great Commission of making disciples, baptizing and teaching them found in Matt. 28:19-20. The five purposes being: evangelism (extend), worship (praise and honor), fellowship (care), discipleship (grow) and ministry (service).

Pastor Tom and I have had good conversations with past and present members of the Youth Ministry team and the Board of Education. What do we want youth ministry to work towards? We identified a goal of equipping and preparing youth to be Christian leaders living out a life of faith beyond this time and place as a high school student in McCook, NE.

This is definitely a lofty goal to shoot for; but it is one worth pursuing. It is with this in mind that we are looking to purposefully and intentionally structure everything we plan, do and say with youth ministry towards this goal of developing, equipping and nurturing Christian leaders for service.

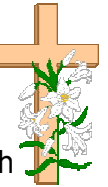

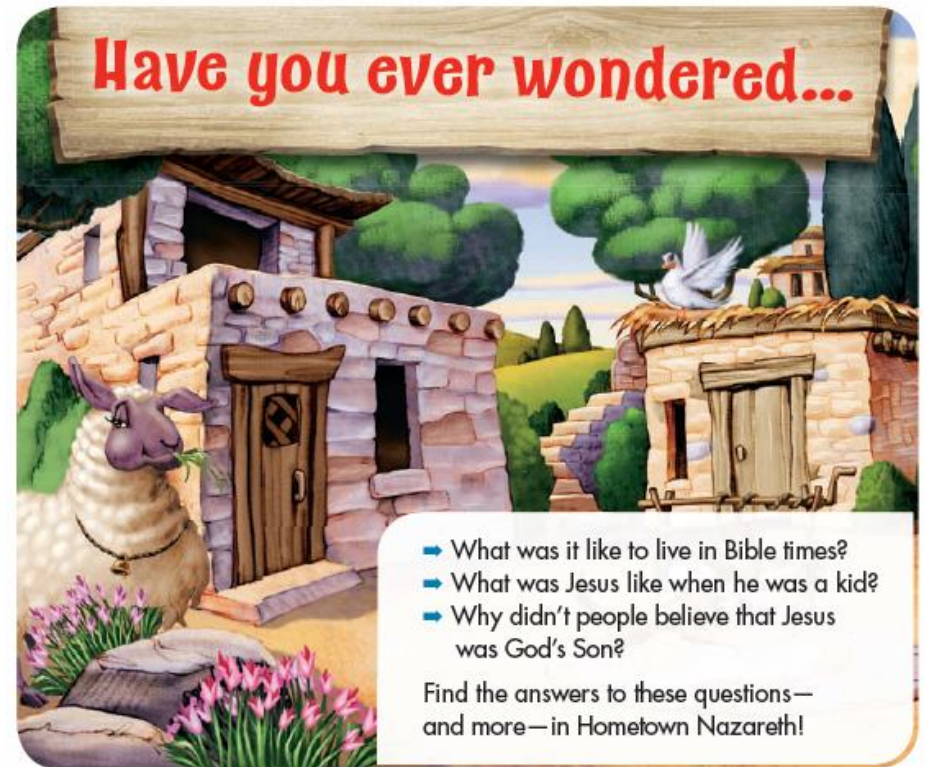
