

Stewardship in the First Commandment

The greatest gift that Martin Luther gave to us was his Small Catechism. The word "enchiridion" is part of the original title of this work. This is the Greek word for "handbook." The Small Catechism is a handbook of the Bible. All the basic knowledge that a Christian needs to understand the faith and live a godly life has been taken from the Bible and distilled into this beautiful little book of Christian piety. Luther starts with the Ten Commandments.

> The First Commandment: You shall have no other gods. What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things. (SC I)

We have a God above us. He is the Lord God and we are not. He is Almighty and in control. He is righteous and good. And therefore, we should fear Him.

This God is also our heavenly Father. He wants us to be saved. He does not want us to suffer His just wrath. He has provided salvation for us in His Son, Jesus Christ. And therefore, we should love

Our heavenly Father will never leave us nor forsake us. He has promised as much $\stackrel{\cdot}{-}$ and the Bible shows us that He always keeps His promises. So, we should trust Him.

In the Large Catechism, Luther explains how money and possessions form one of the greatest temptations against the First Commandment: This I must unfold somewhat more plainly, that it may be understood and perceived by ordinary examples of the contrary. Many a one thinks that he has God and everything in abundance when he has money and possessions; he trusts in them and boasts of them with such firmness and assurance as to care for no one. Lo, such a man also has a god, Mammon by name, i.e., money and possessions, on which he sets all his heart, and which is also the most common idol on earth. He who has money and possessions feels secure, and is joyful and undismayed as though he were sitting in the midst of Paradise. On the other hand, he who has none doubts and is despondent, as though he knew of no God. For very few are to be found who are of good cheer, and who neither mourn nor complain if they have not Mammon. This [care and desire for money] sticks and clings to our nature, even to the grave. (LC I 5-9)

These words of Dr. Luther should call us to repentance; sometimes, we live and act like we don't have a Father in heaven. We seek our comfort and peace outside of His gracious promises. But we do have a Father in heaven. He does love us. All His promises are true. And the Lord will surely provide. If that is our belief, then our outward lives will reflect our belief in our acts of generosity and mercy. We will see money and possessions not as gods but rather as tools for doing God's work.

Remember not to forget! Have you ever needed help in that category? I know I have. Whether it is a string tied around my finger, putting a note on the steering wheel, or turning my hat around backwards, I need help remembering not to forget something. Don't forget to pick up milk before you come home. Remember to drop off your suit coat at the cleaners. It's trash day, are the containers out by the street? So many things that I need to remember are ultimately lost in my chaotic memory bank. Maybe that was the same problem the Israelites had after exiting Egypt! When reading through the Old Testament, it seems they needed something to help them to remember not to forget. Moses says, "Israel, remember this! The Lord... and the Lord alone... is our God. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. Never forget these commands..." (Deuteronomy 6:4-6). It seems it did not take too long before they did forget. Then off on a sinful tangent until the Lord reeled them back in again. I ponder, "why did they so often forget to remember?" Moses even tells them to "Tie these commands on your hands, bind them on your foreheads, and write them on your doorframes." (Deuteronomy 6:8-9). Yet they still forgot that the Lord led them in the wilderness, gave them water from a rock, fed them manna, give them the power to succeed, and ultimately gave them a promise of being the chosen ones (Deuteronomy 8:15-18). I often have wondered how they could possibly forget. It is easy to read through Scripture and marvel at the mighty works of God and what He has done for mankind. Things that never should be forgotten but are. Then I realize I cannot even remember to get a gallon of milk. Do I also forget the things God has done for me? We are all guilty at times when things just aren't going our way. Just like the Israelites. But when the chips are down, it becomes paramount to pull up your faith roots and remember how God has worked in your life. Remember all the times you have been blessed. Not forgetting how you have been washed clean with the waters of Baptism and all Jesus has done for you on the cross. The one who forgives, heals, redeems, and gives you His steadfast love and mercy (Psalm 103:2-5). And most importantly of all is remembering not to forget that God will never forget you and I. He is always by our side. As Christians we know that God is always with us and that there is nowhere we can flee from His presence (Psalm 139:7-8). He gives us joy when we get discouraged (Psalm 16:11), refreshes us when we are weary (Acts 3:20), and takes away our fear when we are in deep waters (Isaiah 43:2). God will not forget you. He has engraved you on the palms of His hands (Isaiah 49:15-16). Dear Lord, forgive me of my forgetfulness. Help me remember all You have done in the past so I can trust You completely with today. In Jesus' Name, Amen.
